#### Bath time



### Ideas to support use of language...

- ✓ Use action words like "washing/washed", "splashing/splashed", "scrubbing/scrubbed" "floating/floated", "pouring/poured", "drying/dried"
- ☑ Use descriptive words like "hot", "cold", "warm", "wet", "dry", "clean", "dirty"
- ☑ Use body part vocabulary as you wash each one (i.e. hands, arms, shoulders, legs, knees, ankles, toes, tummy, back, head, face, hair etc.)



#### Ideas to support understanding of language...

- Ask your child **what for** questions like "What is shampoo for?" "What is the cloth/sponge for?", "What are the taps for?" and "What do we use a towel for?"
- ☑ Have your child follow directions: 1 step (e.g. Scrub your knees; Rub the shampoo in your hair) or 2-step (e.g Scrub your knees then scrub your toes; Rub the shampoo in your hair then rinse it out)
- ☑ Show the differences between concept words like "wet/dry", "dirty/clean", "empty/full", "hot/cold", "out/in", "on/off"



#### Ideas to support speech sounds...

Emphasize these sounds in your words as you enjoy bath time. If your child can, have them try to say them too!

Practice "b" sounds: bath, bubbles, blow bubbles, bathe, bathing, bring, body, brrr, bonk, bedtime

Practice "p" sounds: pop bubbles, poof, pour, play, peek-a-boo, pinky, push, put, pat
